HOW GREAT IS OUR GOD? GOD IS HOLY

What is God's Holiness?

- All God is in his transcendent Majesty and Moral Purity.
- "Kadosh" = To set apart

We need to see what Isaiah saw and respond how Isaiah responded.

I. What did Isaiah Sense?

A. He sensed God's Transcendent Majesty of God

What did he see?

o He saw the Thone and the Train – Rulership/royalty

What did he hear?

- He heard the sound of the Seraphim "Holy Holy" Perfection
 What Scriptures help us to understand the Transcendent Majesty of God?

 - o I Sam 2:2 -
 - o Lk 1:49 -
- B. He sensed the Moral Purity of God

What did he feel?

- He felt the sinless Perfection of God
- o Hab. 1:13 –

II. How did Isaiah Respond?

A. He responded with a sense of "WOW" toward God

You should meditate on God's holiness until...

- Your mind is stretched
- You respond in praise (Ps 29:2)
- You look within to your need
- B. He responded with a sense of "WOE" toward himself

Why don't we do this? We tolerate and justify and excuse sin.

You should evaluate your own need until...

- You are humbled
- You respond in Obedience (I Peter 1:14-16; Rom 12:1)

- 2. Do you think Christians tend to believe Isaiah's declaration that "all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment? Why or why not?
- 3. In view of God's transcendent majesty and infinite moral purity, why is His wrath necessary?
- 4. What are ways we can stretch our minds to realize the great magnitude and significance of God's holiness?
- 5. Read I Peter 1:14-16 How ought we to take seriously the pursuit of personal holiness?
