The Model of Grace & Humility

Welcome: [Pastor Joel]

- Last week we looked at James 4:1-5 which called us to an unadulterated friendship with God. Today we continue in the next verses in that passage and will see that verses 6-10 express how the grace of God extends to the humble.
 - O James 4:6-10 ⁶ But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." ⁷ Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. ⁸ Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. ⁹ Be wretched and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. ¹⁰ Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.
- We need God's grace, which is given to those that humble themselves before God. To rightly understand Grace, we need to examine Jesus, the model of grace and humility. By looking at Paul's explanation and exaltation of the humility of Jesus in Philippians 2:5-11, let's allow Jesus' incarnation to remind us that in humility He came, in humility He gave, and in glory He was exalted.

IN HUMILITY JESUS CAME – Philippians 2:5-7

Philippians 2:5-7- Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, [a] 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, [b] 7 but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, [c] being born in the likeness of men.

IN HUMILITY JESUS GAVE – Philippians 2:8 [Pastor Bernie]

Philippians 2:8 - ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

- Titus 2:11-14 ¹¹ For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, ¹² training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, ¹³ waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of <u>our great God and Savior Jesus Christ</u>, ¹⁴ who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his own possession who are zealous for good works.

IN GLORY JESUS WAS EXALTED – Philippians 2:9-11 [Pastor Steve]

Philippians 2:9-11 - ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Reading: "God's Most Successful Setback" – by John Piper "Good News of Great Joy – Daily Readings for Advent" p 35-36. [Pastor Steve]

Christmas was God's most successful setback. He has always delighted to show his power through apparent defeat. He makes tactical retreats in order to win strategic victories.

Joseph, was promised glory and power in his dream (Gen 37:5-11). But to achieve that victory he had to become a slave in Egypt. And as if that were not enough, when his conditions improved because of his integrity, he was mad worse than a slave – a prisoner.

But it was all planned. For there in prison he met Pharaoh's butler, who eventually brought him to Pharaoh who put him over Egypt. What an unlikely route to glory!

But that is God's way – even for his Son. He emptied himself and took the form of a slave. Worse than a slave – a prisoner – and was executed. But like Joseph, he kept his integrity "*Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow*" (Phil 2:9-10).

And this is God's way for us too. We are promised glory – if we suffer with him (Rom 8:17). The way up is down. The way forward is backwards. The way to success is through divinely appointed setbacks. They will always look and feel like failure. But if Joseph and Jesus teach us anything this Christmas it is this: "God meant it for good!" (Gen 50:20).
