Strength for Steadfastness

Welcome: [Pastor Bernie]

- Today's passage calls us to and encourages us in perseverance. We'll consider the second part of the passage we began last week from James 5:7-12. Last week we saw in verses 7-9 how the coming of the Lord teaches us self-restraint. Today as we continue James' exhortation in verses 10-12, we will realize how God's character both produces and blesses steadfastness.
 - O James 5:10-12 ¹⁰ As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. ¹¹ Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful. ¹² But above all, my brothers, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath, but let your "yes" be yes and your "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation.
- We need strength to remain steadfast. Where are we to look for perseverance? In this passage, James directs the attention off of ourselves by putting a bright spotlight on God's purposes and character. Today we will let Scripture and song remind us of these things as we rely upon Him to faithfully endure.
