- Worship Service: What does a doctrinally-sound, grace-infused godly life look like? In Titus 2:1-10 Paul gives Titus portraits of what godliness looks like for all believers within the church. Last week we looked at the 1st of 4 categories in the passage, expressing what godliness looks like for the *mature*. Today we move to the next category where Paul gives Titus exhortations to the *young*. What does godliness look like for young men and women?

MUTUAL SUBMISSION OUT OF A REVERENCE FOR CHRIST

Scripture on Mutual Submission out of Reverence for Christ: [Pastor Bernie]

• Believers should be motivated by a reverence for Christ and His Word. Submission in our relationships is the result of a submission to Christ & His Word. In the following passages, note how Paul weaves this essential motivation throughout his commands to submit to one another.

Ephesians 5:21-25 - ²¹ submitting to one another <u>out of reverence for Christ.</u> ²² Wives, submit to your own husbands, <u>as to the Lord</u>. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. ²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, <u>as Christ loved the</u> <u>church</u> and gave himself up for her, *Ephesians 6:1, 4-6 - Children, obey your parents <u>in the Lord</u>, for this is right. ⁴ Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction <u>of the Lord</u>.*

⁵ Bondservants,^[a] obey your earthly masters^[b] with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, <u>as you would Christ</u>, ⁶ not by the way of eye-service, as peoplepleasers, <u>but as bondservants of Christ</u>, doing the will of God from the heart,

Colossians 3:18-4:1 - ¹⁸ Wives, submit to your husbands, as is <u>fitting in the</u> <u>Lord.</u> ¹⁹ Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them. ²⁰ Children, obey your parents in everything, <u>for this pleases the Lord</u>. ²¹ Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged. ²² Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters,^[1] not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, <u>but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord</u>. ²³ Whatever you do, work heartily, <u>as for the Lord and not for men</u>, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. <u>You are serving the Lord</u> <u>Christ</u>. ²⁵ For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality. **4** Masters, treat your bondservants^[a] justly and fairly, <u>knowing that you also have a Master in heaven.</u>

Message: Titus 2:4-5 [Pastor Steve]

But as for you, teach what accords with sound^[a] doctrine.

² Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness. ³ Older women likewise are to be reverent in behavior, not slanderers or slaves to much wine. They are to teach what is good,

⁴ and so train the young women to love their husbands and children, ⁵ to be selfcontrolled, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be reviled. ⁶ Likewise, urge the younger men to be selfcontrolled.

⁷ Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, dignity, ⁸ and sound speech that cannot be condemned, so that an opponent may be put to shame, having nothing evil to say about us.

⁹Bondservants^[b] are to be submissive to their own masters in everything; they are to be well-pleasing, not argumentative, ¹⁰ not pilfering, but showing all good faith, so that in everything they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior.
